










### Since 2016, CCNP has responded to food insecurity through the distribution of healthy food items to the Westlake/ Pico-Union and surrounding communities.

The COVID-19 pandemic caused an exponential increase in the number of households in need of this essential service. In response and with the support of key partners, including the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank and Sam Simon Feeding Families Foundation, CCNP expanded the Food Security Program to meet the needs of the community, to include grocery food distribution, pop-up food distribution, hot meal delivery, and nutrition education 52 weeks a year.

CCNP continued to be that trusted organization providing access to essential services and remained committed to our core mission and vision, while adapting to the sudden changes to better serve the needs of our community.

CCNP assisted **360 community members** with pubic benefit applications, including health insurance, CalFresh, CalWorks, Unemployment, utility discount programs, rental assistance, and other life-enhancing services.

### **BUILDING FINANCIAL HABITATS THAT LEAD TO FINANCIAL STABILITY.**

Ceyda P. has been participating with CCNP for several years. In the last two years Ceyda has realized the importance in saving, and joined CCNP's Matched Emergency Savings Account Program, MESA. Month after month, Ceyda made her monthly deposits and in May 2022 she completed the 6-month program with a total savings of \$1,500 and with a match from CCNP of \$340. Ceyda stated that she was able to develop a habit of putting money on the side through this program and will keep doing so long after the program. "Thanks to the CCNP MESA Program I was able to gain a positive habit and I want to keep implementing it in the future."



### **ENSURING FINANCIAL SECURITY**

Margarita H. has been a participant in CCNP's financial coaching program since 2018. When she began meeting with her financial coaches, Margarita had recently separated from her partner of over 20 years and was feeling lost, especially with her finances. In 2018, Margarita was unscored and had no idea what credit meant. Over the years her financial coach continued to help her build on her finances. In February 2022, Margarita and her coach pulled her credit score, and to her surprise, she was scored at 726. Throughout the last 3 years she has opened a checking account, two credit builder accounts, and now a savings account to participate in CCNP's MESA program (matched emergency saving account). She stated that she was relieved to know that not only had she build credit, but had a higher credit limit. Along the way, she consistently mentioned how happy she is to have learned so many good habits of savings and healthy spending throughout her sessions and has a sense of accomplishment. Her next financial goal is to open a credit card in order to have a variety of credit lines. Along with her financial goals, Margarita has also worked on her career goals. One of the skills that she had started to work on pre-pandemic was her computer skills. She paid for a school but felt unsupported once the class ended. When her coach informed her that CCNP is launching a new program (Microsoft Digital literacy training) she jumped on the opportunity. As she progressed, she became much more confident in her skills of sending and receiving emails, creating a word document, and using an excel sheet to create her personal budget.



"Thank you for providing the services that I really need. I took a computer class before, but the teacher was not as understanding and patient as CCNP is. I learned a little then but was not helped with continuing to practice and activities. Here, with CCNP I feel I have that support that I need and know will be ongoing. TAXI LATT CAR. PAY Israel and Leticia were first time tax filers and heard about CCNP's VITA program and decided to give it a try. With the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Israel, like many others, lost his job and fell behind on rent and had trouble making ends meet. With four children at home, Israel and Leticia knew it was crucial to apply for an ITIN and file their taxes to ensure financial stability. After two months, they received ITIN approval letters and were able to file both federal and state tax returns. Through CCNP's VITA program, the family increased their awareness about the tax preparation process which opened their opportunities to qualify for credits, including EITC, CalEITC, Child Tax Credit, Young Child Tax Credit, and COVID-19 stimulus funds. The family received over \$8,000 in tax refunds which they used to pay their rent, pay off debts, and purchase essential items for their family.

I'm not only thanking you for helping me, but for all the people who are helped there in the center, because there are many families who are looking for assistance. God Bless." CCNP in collaboration with multiple partners took steps to ensure the community had equitable access to updated COVID-19 information, understood their housing rights and was actively helping families stay housed during this unsettling time.

### **COLLABORATION IN ACTION.**

Ms. M came to CCNP with a looming court order for eviction. As a family of nine, seven of which are 12 and younger, Ms. M was worried that she and her family would be removed from their home. In collaboration with Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles (LAFLA) and Community Investment For Families (CIFD) CCNP was able to connect Ms. M and her family with a free legal service provider. Ms. M worked with CCNP's Tenant Stability Advisor and the legal service provider to ensure she had a solid case against eviction. Ms M. also received financial coaching assistance, and learned how to better manage her money. As Ms. M awaited for her options, the relationship with her landlord continued to be strained. However, with the help of CCNP and the legal provider, threats for eviction were properly handled alleviating the family's stress. In October, good news was delivered and Ms. M was able to pay off her rent and the court case was dropped! Ms. M is grateful for the services CCNP has to offer as her whole demeanor changed and her mental health improved!



### **ENSURING HOUSING STABILITY**

During the 2021-2022 program year, CCNP buckled down and worked hard to ensure community members stay housed. CCNP worked tirelessly to ensure that individuals got the support they needed and connected them to legal services.

#### 77 individuals participated in the Eviction Defense Program, with 62 reducing their housing instability.



#### **KEEPING FAMILIES HOUSED.**

With a family of four, including a High School Senior preparing to go off to college, Mr. R and his family could only gather so much extra each month to pay off their arrears. When he received a letter from his Landlord's lawyer, threatening a 3-Day Perform or Quit, Mr. R was frightened that his family would finally lose their home. Mr. R. reached out to CCNP and with the help of the Housing Stability Advisor, they completed a StayHousedLA referral in the event that the Landlord followed through with her actions. CCNP reached out to the landlord, and was able to get verbal confirmation that she was simply trying to get the back rent paid, but did not really want to go through an eviction. An agreement was made that the landlord would stand down and allow for the family to pay back their arrears in an adequate time as long as they kept paying their current rent. Through collaborations, Mr. R and his family stayed safe in their comfort of their home: "Thank you very much. CCNP has relieved us from extra pressure. We have less stress now, and are planning for what's next."

- "From the beginning, I felt supported in my case, and although you could not help me with rental assistance from the Center, I did not feel alone, and I felt like there was hope. I am eternally grateful for the help from CCNP. I feel a lot of trust in [CCNP]."

## 162 unduplicated students

were engaged in Youth Programs, benefiting from multiple services available, including academic tutoring, mentoring, internships and volunteer opportunities.





Lizeth E. has been participating in CCNP services since she was in elementary school and is now a senior at UC Riverside! Throughout the years, she has participated in different CCNP services/programs like tutoring, case management, financial coaching and was once an intern! Through financial coaching, Lizeth learned how to budget, save and how to build credit. Her main focus at the time of her financial coaching enrollment was to start a savings fund and work on her credit as she prepared to start college. To achieve both of these goals simultaneously, Lizeth was introduced to the Credit Builder account which would allow her to save for a year while also helping her credit as these payments are reported to the credit bureaus. She finished the program saving around \$794 and was invited to CCNP's savings celebration where she received a matched check of \$250. Although it was challenging for her to not touch the money, she was glad at the end and it helped her build credit. Lizeth plans to use her money for her upcoming graduation expenses and to pay off grad school applications. Although it has become harder for Lizeth to stay connected to CCNP since she is in college, she still connects with her financial coach to see what new programs CCNP has to offer.

### **CLOSING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE**

CCNP provided multiple hotspots to families in need free of charge and laptops for youth to help with virtual learning!





24 Laptops and 5 iPads were distributed!

14 hotspots were distributed!

The Frida C. Fox Foundation sponsorship was exactly the ray of hope many students were looking for when they seeked opportunities at CCNP. This was the first chance CCNP was able to provide students with a paid internship, despite their legal status. This is something that could not have been accomplished if the student had been referred to a YouthSource. Team CCNP is greatful for the opportunity to have impacted the 27 youth and their families.

She has taken the initiative to reach out to CCNP and become an intern: *"I saw that many of my classmates were completing volunteer hours, and I asked myself, why not me? And now I am here and I love it."* 



Michelle B had been a participant in CCNP's College Corner programming since Fall 2021 where she engaged as a student volunteer. Michelle loved the opportunity to give back to the community through volunteering and supporting the Food Security Program or conducting clerical work. "My experience overall was nice due to an amazing, supportive and friendly environment."


Michelle shared that she learned critical thinking skills, she learned how to network, be creative, be a team player and problem solving. By the end of internship, Michelle decided that she would be attending Santa Monica City College to then transfer to Cal State Northridge.

Michelle shared that she would be using the money earned to "pay my driving classes which will help me commute to my school." Estephany A. is high school student in 10th grade who unfortunately did not qualify for DACA. Estephany had been looking for work opportunities throughout different spaces, however she was unable to locate any work opportunities due to her legal status.

"It was amazing and I met a lot of new people who taught me different perspectives which was great. I learned about teamwork and also patience and hard work. My motivation to complete my internship was finally having something where I felt productive and as if I was part of a community. This experience taught be the value of hard work and how we have to appreciate things more since it is very hard to wake up and have a job."



### **SPOTLIGHT ON A YOUTH LEADER**





Within in one year Luis went from youth participant to part of the CCNP team. Before coming to CCNP, Luis's mentality was to find a job, earn money and spend it. He had no intent for saving his money and had just recently decided to drop out of continuation school to focus on work. However, once Luis started interning at CCNP, he began to open up and trust the staff. He was recognized by multiple staff members as a very driven and hardworking individual. His work ethic preceded him as our very own Executive Director, Margarita, noticed him. Margarita decided to offer Luis a parttime position at CCNP, however to be hired as an employee at CCNP, it is required to have a high school diploma. When Luis found out, he was happy and upset. Upset because he knew if he would have stayed in school, he would have had his diploma and could have secured a steady job. Happy because he knew he had found a new home at CCNP, where everyone wanted the best for him. The job offer Margarita proposed motivated Luis to re-enroll in school. With CCNP's help, Luis graduated with his high school diploma`in June 2022 and is now a full time employee at CCNP.

"From bagging up groceries at the food bank, to outreaching to our community about all the resources CCNP provides as an intern, I knew I wanted to work at CCNP. Margarita, offered me a position as outreach coordinator, however, in order to accept the position, I needed my high school diploma. That is when I decided to go back to school and earned my high school diploma. CCNP has helped me grow in many ways, such as helping clients apply for utility discounts, rental assistance and so much more!"


